The trail will be marked with red flags. **Please note this is a one-way hike.** Make arrangements to have hikers picked up at their ending location.

There is no cost for the hike, however a donation of \$2.00 per person to offset operating expenses is appreciated.

SKYLINE HIKE MILEAGE, TIMES, & PICK-UP POINTS:

- 2 Miles** The 2-mile hikers should be picked up at the corner of Skyline Drive and Turnbull Canyon Rd.
2-mile hikers should check-in by 10:00 AM.
- 5 Miles** The 5-mile hikers should be picked up at the corner of Colima Road and Camino Del Sur.
5-mile hikers should check-in by 9:00 AM.
- 6 Miles** The 6-mile hikers should be picked up at the corner of Hacienda Blvd. and Buddhist Temple.
6-mile hikers should check-in by 8:00 AM.
- 11 Miles** The 11-mile hikers should be picked up at the corner of North Harbor Blvd. and Fullerton Road, just south of East Pathfinder Road. **11-mile hikers should check-in by 7:00 AM.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION (PLEASE READ):

1. Each group is responsible for picking-up their own hikers at the end of their hike.
2. At the 11 mile hike pick-up point. Fullerton Road intersects North Harbor at 2 points (horseshoe) The 11 mile hike completion point is at the corner of N. Harbor Blvd and the northern Fullerton Road intersection (just south of East Pathfinder Road and the Pathfinder Community Regional Park)
3. For your safety, do not hike back to the starting point if flag markers have been pulled up.
4. The Skyline Trail is a public trail open to all. Boy Scouts of America provides insurance for their members, however all other hikers assume their own risk and responsibility.
5. Units are responsible for securing a Tour Permit and Permission Slips for all participants.
