General Rules

- NO electronic equip, radios, games, DVD, boom boxes. Only radios permitted will be two-way for camp staff or unit adults.
- No sheath knives, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, or firearms.
- Leave No Trace guidelines will apply at all times.
- Quiet Time is at 10:00PM, the time we request all attendees to be in there campsites. At 12:00AM, we request that all attendees be in their tents
- No ground fires permitted. Charcoal for cooking can be used in an elevated container.
- The Venturee will not be called off because of weather.
- Early departure (Saturday night, LDS) must be declared at registration.
- Exit packet will be exchanged at conclusion of Venturee for Advisor/President Exit Survey forms.
- Fire regulations require that Advisors notify Venturee Staff of any unscheduled departures.
- Venture uniforms, either Class A or B, must be worn. **NO CAMOUFLAGE.**
- **Parking only allowed in designated areas.** Vehicles will be logged in as they arrive with license plate, and unit number. You will be told to move your vehicle if in violation. Let us know if you need handicap parking. We will find a good location for you.
- **We can take a maximum of 90 people and 24 cars. Carpooling is strongly encouraged. Extra cars not parked in the campground parking area will need a Forest Adventure Pass.**
- No liquid fuels.
- All medical incidents other than minor cuts and scrapes must be reported to Venturee headquarters.
- All units must pre-register and pay the camp fees; registration at the campsite will include a late fee of 20%. (If you have pre-registered at least 80% of your unit, the 20% late fee will be waived). The cost of the Venturee is \$12 per attendee if payment is made prior to September 1st, and \$15 per attendee if made after September 1st. If the turnout is larger than anticipated and we are short patches, those late signups may not receive a Venturee patch until a later date.
- In event of a tie in any judged event, both participants will receive the same award. Once judged, the score is official.
- All units must abide by the above rules. Units that refuse to abide by these rules run the risk of being denied any awards and patches, and may be asked to leave. There will be no refunds. If it is necessary to enforce this rule, the Venturee Team along with the Unit leaders will discuss prior to enforcement.

Water and Stoves Maintain the water supply for cooking and cleanup. Establish a safe place for stoves to be fueled and used, and have them ready to light before the cooks need them

Cooking Assemble ingredients and follow recipes to prepare and serve meals.
Have wash water heating on the stove before serving meals.

Cleanup Set out wash and rinse water, oversee the washing of group cooking gear, stow pots and utensils and dispose of garbage
(For more on washing dishes in camp see the Boy Scout Handbook.)

Food Storage Maintain a bear line or other food storage system to protect provisions from animals and weather. Secure all food items at night and whenever camp will be left unattended. All food items should be off the ground.

IN TROOP CAMPSITE

1. **SOUND ALARM** by yelling **FIRE** and notify camp headquarters fire warden.
2. **START FIGHTING THE FIRE** by using available troop equipment.
3. **DROP TENTS** if necessary
4. When the central alarm is sounded to warn camp, quickly mobilize in your troop. Move to your pre-assigned point immediately and await directions.
5. A runner reports to camp headquarters for instructions from the camp fire warden.

OUTSIDE TROOP CAMPSITE

1. If You discover a fire anywhere in camp, report immediately to camp headquarters so the alarm may be sounded and fire authorities notified.
2. Camp fire warden sounds central alarm and your troop follows steps 4 and 5 above.
3. Members of the central camp staff will man the camp fire-fighting equipment assigned to them, under the direction of camp fire warden. You will assist as directed by camp fire warden.

In case of fire in our campsite we will notify the camp fire warden and follow the instructions of our troop fire warden.

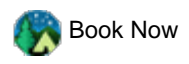
